Meet Karen, a Meals on Wheels Client

At 91 years old, Karen's life has been rich with adventure and creativity. Born in San Francisco to a Norwegian father and an Irish-English mother, she devoted her high school years to art, earning a scholarship to the California School of Fine Arts & Crafts. However, her path took an unexpected turn after she became a young mother. Her journey led her abroad, where she spent nearly three decades living in cities like Oslo, Rome, and Spain. Karen's career mirrored her adventurous spirit, including roles with Trans World Airlines (TWA), various sales positions, and her favorite job as an interviewer in research studies with the University of Chicago.

After three decades in Europe, Karen returned to the Bay Area to be closer to her family, particularly her grown children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, who are the joys of her life. But as the years passed, Karen noticed a change in her energy, especially when it came to cooking. Once a passionate home cook who loved preparing meals from scratch, Karen no longer had the drive to spend hours in the kitchen. "I would rather starve than cook," she admits with a laugh. That's when she turned to Meals on Wheels.

Since then, receiving meals has become essential for Karen's well-being. "It's good and nourishing," she says. "It keeps me alive, actually." The meals don't just ease the burden of daily cooking; they also help manage the rising cost of food, which can be overwhelming for many seniors. "The meals are a tremendous help financially," Karen adds.



The connection with her volunteer drivers has been just as valuable as the meals. While living in Martinez, Karen formed a special bond with Jim, a volunteer driver for Meals on Wheels. What began as simple meal drop-offs during COVID gradually grew into a friendship. Jim would bring meals into her home, and eventually, he would sit and chat with Karen, sharing stories from their respective time spent in Europe. For Karen, Jim was not just a volunteer—he became a trusted companion.

Now living in Pinole, Karen has found a new friend in her current volunteer driver, Kim. Just like with Jim, Karen enjoys the meaningful interactions she shares with Kim, reinforcing that Meals on Wheels is about more than just food—it's about fostering human connection and community.

For hundreds of seniors like Karen, Meals on Wheels is a lifeline. The program does more than provide nutritious meals; it helps individuals maintain their independence, stay healthy, and avoid the dangers of isolation. As Karen points out, "When seniors get hungry, they're low on energy. I didn't realize that for a long time, but it makes a huge difference." The program's impact extends beyond the physical, giving recipients comfort in knowing that someone cares—whether it's through a delivered meal or a simple conversation with a friendly driver.



As Karen reflects on her experience, she emphasizes the importance of Meals on Wheels in her life: "You're keeping people alive." The program not only sustains her physically but also emotionally, reminding her that she is part of a community that values her health and well-being.

Meals on Wheels continues to be a vital service for seniors across our county, helping individuals like Karen live with dignity and independence in the comfort of their own homes.
