Together Through Changing Seasons

As the fall leaves turn and the days grow shorter, many of our homebound neighbors face another kind of season—one marked by uncertainty, isolation, and financial strain. For more than 35 years, Meals on Wheels Contra Costa has stood beside them, helping guarantee that nutritious meals and caring connections reach older adults throughout Contra Costa County.

Our commitment is more important now than ever. Across our community, government funding has not kept pace with the growing senior population—leaving Meals on Wheels Contra Costa to bridge the funding gap. Here in Contra Costa County, government support covers roughly three-quarters of the actual meal costs. The rest is made possible through the generosity of community members, foundations, and local partners who believe no senior should have to choose between food and other essentials.

For many seniors in Contra Costa County, the Meals on Wheels program is more than a meal—it's a link to stability, kindness, and care.

One of those seniors is Reina Platero, who has received meals from one of our service providers, Meals on Wheels West Contra Costa (MOWWCC), for several years. At 75, Reina looks forward to celebrating her birthday this fall with much gratitude. Throughout her life, she has worked tirelessly to support her family and to find belonging in her community. Growing up with a language barrier wasn't easy, but her determination built bridges where words sometimes could not.

Why Community Support Matters More Than Ever

Across the country, thousands of seniors are waiting for the daily meals & connection they desperately need. According to Meals on Wheels America's 2025 Waitlist Research Initiative, one in three Meals on Wheels providers nationwide has a waitlist, & tens of thousands of older adults waiting—sometimes for months—to begin receiving services.

The leading cause is insufficient funding. Federal support has not kept pace with the rapidly growing senior population, while food, fuel, & staffing costs continue to rise. Many programs are doing everything they can, but without sustainable financial resources, the gap between need & capacity keeps widening.

Here in Contra Costa County, Meals on Wheels Contra Costa continues to help bridge that gap. And thanks to community support, our service providers are not facing waitlists due to of funding. However, some communities – particularly in East County like Pittsburg, Antioch, & Brentwood – are experiencing waitlists caused by volunteer shortages. These challenges underscore how essential both funding & community engagement are to ensuring every senior receives the meals & care they deserve.


